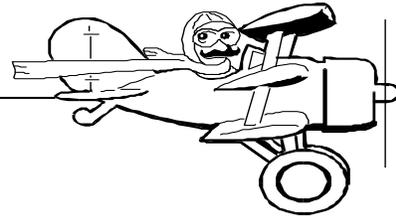

If we make the assumption that everything was fine last time we flew it so it should be OK now you might end up like the last frame in the comic above. It doesn't take long to perform a range check; it takes a lot longer to fix your plane from a SPLAT if you can find it.

A couple of reminders; fire extinguishers are required at your flight station when flying electric or gas powered planes. We will be performing a noise level verification this month. Our intent is to document the noise level at various locations around our field. It's better to be proactive than reactive. One last reminder is that trees will reach out and grab your plane and want to keep it if you get too close. Give the trees their space and you will be safe.

The first Winnie Fly turned out to be a social event due to the gusty wind conditions. Our second Winnie fly is on Thursday August 8<sup>th</sup>. Bring your favorite plane and a plate to pass. If all the stars line up we'll have a roof on the shelter by then.
