

FROM THE PRESIDENT


Greetings;

I've always liked Biplanes and the EZ cruiser so I added another wing to the cruiser. It's a great flier. It flies beautiful and is much more reactive.




Joe Suarez built this Sig 20 with electric power. Joe says it a great Flier.
